

Corby AC Awards 2009

Charlotte Bowling and Scott Kendall were voted the female and male athletes of the year when Corby AC held its annual track and field presentation evening at Great Oakley Cricket Club.

Bowling's achievement throughout the summer was finishing second in the Inter Girls 300m hurdles at the English Schools and the week after winning the British Schools title on her international debut. She ended up running the fourth fastest time in the event in Great Britain.

Kendall also improved dramatically and was ranked ninth in the UK in the Under-15 javelin and came seventh in the English Schools.

The sprint award – based on graded times – went to under-13 Jason Wong while the endurance trophy was secured by under-15 Bethany Smyton.

Under-15 Emma MacFarlane won the combined events award thanks to her fine performance when finishing tenth in the English Schools.

The Inter Girls duo of Rachel Tyler and Gaby Bangay won the throwing and jumping awards respectively. The former was third in the English Schools discus and ranked fifth while Bangay won the Midlands title and was ranked 11th in the pole vault. Ruby Goodall came out top from those nominated for the newcomer award.
