

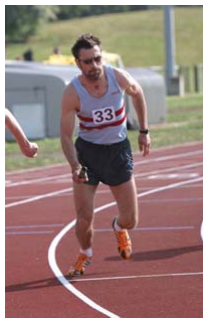
## Graded Open Meeting

### Corby

May 23<sup>rd</sup> 2007



Bethany Smyton and Pete Straiton both smashed their lifetime bests at the second Corby AC open graded meeting at the Rockingham Triangle. Smyton knocked half a second from her previous best when she won her 800m race in a superb 2.25.7 to move to fourth place on the Under-13 Girls National Ranking list for the season. Also running well in the same race for Corby was Under-15 Girl Charlotte Cotter who reduced her best to 2.29.9 when placing third. In the other 800m race Emma MacFarlane had a fine win in 2.45.5 while another Corby Under-13 Girl, Caitlin Davies, did well to place third in 2.48.1.



Straiton knocked well over a second from his former 400m best when he finished runner-up in 50.6 to Sheffield's Sean Brindley (49.2) while also recording personal bests was the Corby Under-17 duo of Simon Franklin (54.3) and Ally Fowler (55.8).

The fastest 100m time on the night came from Corby's Paul Webster who clocked 11.3 while his younger club colleagues Caitlin Davies (14.8) and Scott Kendall (14.2) both also won their respective races. Kendall also took the 200m in 29.0 while Erik Aselius (23.3) was placed second in the top 200m race which was won in 22.7 by Brindley.

On the field Rebecca Wymant and Emma MacFarlane came out top in their respective long jump competitions while Kyle Bowling defeated Kendall (24.39m) in a close Under-15 Boys' javelin competition with 25.75m.



Also held on the night was a couple of Northants Under-11 championship events in which Daventry's Emily Print set a new county record with 3.72m in the Girls' long jump while the corresponding Boys' contest went to Corby's Matthew Paul with his leap of 3.46m and silver to newcomer Jacob Smyton with 3.28m. Paul also won the 600m in 2.01.0 while on the Girls' side Corby secured all the medals when Abigail Morrow-Harris won in a new championship best of 2.02.3 from Georgia Bevins (2.08.3) and Holly Bevins (2.10.4).
