

Troy Garrity ran his fastest marathon for a number of years when he finished third in the Mablethorpe event. The Corby AC runner came home in a time of 2.48.42 behind the unattached pair of Stuart Buchan (2.45.57) and David Smithers, who clocked a winning time of 2.41.52.

Also in action for Corby over the marathon distance was Neal Humphreys who competed in the Robin Hood event at Nottingham. His time of 2.53.29 slotted him into 17<sup>th</sup> position as Sale Harrier Pumlani Bangani took top honours in 2.25.28 ahead of Southend's Hendrik Zietsman (2.25.45). Kettering Town Harrier Paul Marlow was also in the race and came 383<sup>rd</sup> in 3.48.52.

Held in conjunction was a half marathon in which Adam Smith of the Harriers ran 1.40.19 for 830<sup>th</sup> and Corby's Larry Wise was 1,793<sup>rd</sup> in a time of 1.48.49.

Kym Wheeler was successful in her first race as a veteran-50 when she won that category at the Grunty Fen half marathon. The Corby AC runner covered the distance in 1.38.57 to finish 21<sup>st</sup> overall as Durham University's Felicity Milton won easily in 1.16.29 from Ipswich's Jennie Roberts (1.20.38).

Elsewhere on the roads Orlingbury's Maree Jesson finished a fine second in the Bedford Harriers invitation 10km. The Northampton Road Runner came home in a time of 40.54 behind fellow veteran-35 Astrid McKeown of North Herts, who recorded an excellent winning time of 37.00.
