

**World Masters Championships**  
**Riccione, Italy**  
**9<sup>th</sup> September 2007**



Tony Wells added to his already outstanding list of World Veteran medals when he picked up a silver and a bronze in the World Masters Championships in Riccione, Italy.

The Corby AC 58-year-old qualified for the final of the 100m hurdles with a 15.86 clocking in his heat to finish runner-up behind American Thaddeus Wilson (15.56).

In the final the same two runners came out on top with Wilson landing the title with a slick 15.38 while Wells went faster than his heat time to take the silver in 15.78 from another USA man, James Woolvin Broun (16.09).

In the 400m hurdles Wells won his heat in 68.03 to make it to the final. Once there he found himself up against Wilson again but ran a fine race to clinch the bronze in 65.77 while ahead of him fellow Briton Anthony Roker snatched the title in a frantic finish with Wilson after both recorded the same time of 64.57.

Another Corby athlete in action was Timea Latinovics who returned a fine time of 65.64 in the heats of the veteran-40 400m. Representing Hungary, she also competed in the 800m – an event which was a straight final on times from two heats. She clocked 2.30.54 to place 11<sup>th</sup> as Belgian Corinne Debaets won in 2.14.07 from Poland's Zafia Wieceiorkowska (2.15.34) and Brazilian Maria Figueiredo (2.15.74).
