



Sarah-Anne de Kremer's late call up to compete as a guest in the Loughborough International saw her involved in a superb competition in which the British Senior Women's record was broken.

The Corby AC Under-17 javelin international was delighted to be part of athletic history and despite not achieving a personal best she gave a good account of herself against older opposition.

After going over 40m on a couple of occasions she produced her best effort in the final round when she threw 41.69m to finish in sixth place – one ahead of Simone Huggin-Ward (40.75m), who was representing the GB Junior Team.

The final round was also the one in which Goldie Sayers broke the British record of 64.87m (set by Kelly Morgan in 2002) with a magnificent effort of 65.05m which added well over 3m to her former best.
